COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS OVERVIEW

CCP Program

CCP is a dual enrollment program that provides Ohio students in grades 7-12 the opportunity to earn transcripted high school and college credits at the same time by taking courses at Ohio colleges or universities.

Purpose of CCP

To enhance students' career readiness and postsecondary success, while providing a wide variety of options to college-ready students, at no cost to students and families.

General Information

- All Ohio public colleges and some private colleges provide College Credit Plus programs.
- Students can choose from a variety of courses as determined by placement and course eligibility rules.
- Credits earned satisfy both high school and college credit for courses.

- Students can take the classes during the summer, fall, or spring.
- Students may apply to multiple colleges. Students may also attend multiple colleges.

How many classes can à student take?

 Students may be enrolled in up to 30 credits per year, which includes high school classes.

30 - (high school units x **3**) = Max CCP credits

• Maximum number of credits allowed during 7th-12th grade=120

College Credit Plus Options

There are 3 ways students can participate in College Credit Plus Program.

- 1. Take courses at the college campus
- 2. Take online courses independently offered by colleges
- 3. Take a course offered at Taylor High School taught by a THS staff member

Admission Process General Info

- Students must turn in Letter of Intent by April 1, 2022. This is turned into the high school counselor
- Students must apply for admission to the college. This is done independently through the college website.
- Students must be admitted based on the specific college requirements. This may include placement assessments like the ACT or Math/English Placement Tests.
- Colleges have the final decision on student admission. They will communicate this directly with the student.
- You will be required to sign a permission slip acknowledging that some courses contain mature content. This form will be supplied by the college.

Admission Process for online courses or courses taken at the college

- Student will attend an orientation with the college and meet with an advisor.
- Student will register independently for courses using the online system at the college.
- Student should work with the high school counselor to coordinate both high school and college courses.
- Student should follow all requirements set by each college instructor for the course they are taking.

Admission Process for THS CCP Courses Taught by THS staff

- 1. Turn in Letter of Intent by April 1, 2022
- 2. Apply to Cincinnati State-

- 3. Sign up for the course through the THS High School Scheduling Process
- 4. Students are then automatically registered for the college course. No further registration is needed.

Important things to know about College Credit Plus...

Students must successfully complete and pass course to earn the credit.

If a student withdraws after the drop deadline or fails the course, the college and high school transcript will reflect the final grade. The student will also be responsible for the cost of the tuition for the course.

The high school transcript must match the college transcript. The high school course will be weighted as the highest weight offered in that subject area.

There are course eligibility rules that students must follow. Students will work with a college advisor after being admitted to the college to plan the best pathway for their specific postsecondary goals. Many students try to take general education courses during high school to lessen the amount of time and money they will spend in college.

The best way to plan what CCP courses your child should take is to look up the college and major your child is interested in. This can be found on the college website.

Ohio Transfer Module Certificate Cincinnati State

- The Ohio Transfer Module (OTM) is a set of general education coursework recognized by the state of Ohio as transferable to any public institution of higher education.
- Students earning an associate's degree in an Applied Science or Applied Business field who plan to continue in a bachelor's degree program can add the Ohio Transfer Module Certificate to provide a complete set of transferable general education courses.
- Students work with an advisor to ensure that the courses chosen for the OTM Certificate meet the needs of the institution where the student will complete their bachelor's degree.
- Some institutions will accept the OTM as a "block credential," allowing students to transfer to a bachelor's degree program with all general education courses considered completed.
